## CERTIFICATE OF DISABILITY FOR DISCHARGE.

(To be used, in duplicate, in all cases of discharge on account of disability.)

*Fredric Case*, a *Private* of Captain *Wilbur F. Stevens* Company, (B) of the *Twenty Ninth* Regiment of United States *O.V.I.* was enlisted by *Captain W. F. 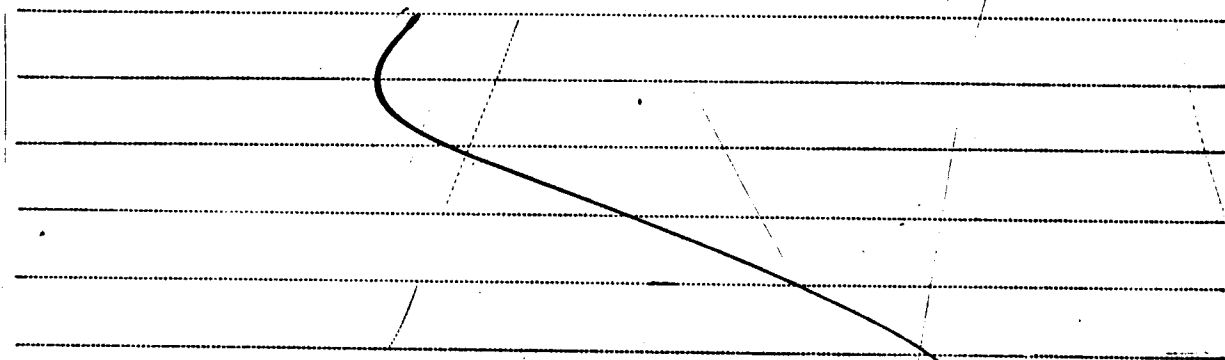
Sir:

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office that Frederick Case was enrolled on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of Aug, 1861, at Pierpont in Co. "B", 29<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Ohio Volunteers, to serve 3 years or during the war, and mustered into service as a Pvt. on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of Sept, 1861, at Jefferson O, in Co. "B", 29<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Ohio Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Rolls of Co. "B", of that Regiment, for the months of from enrollment to Dec. 31, 1862, he is reported Present - Jan. & Feb. 1863 Discharged for disability at Dumfries Va. Feb. 13. 1863. Returns for Feb. 1863 Discharged Feb. 18. 1863 - Regt. was at Frederick, Md. Nov 30. 1862. Rolls and Returns do not show disability that month. Cont. of Disability reports him disch. at Dumfries Va. Feb. 18<sup>th</sup> 1863.

# DECLARATION FOR PENSION.

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION

State of New York, County of Fulton ss:

On this 23 day of August, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and 13 personally appeared before me, a Commissioner of the State of New York within and for the county and state aforesaid Lucy Margaret Base aged 76 years, a resident of Johnstown, County of Fulton, State of New York, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain pension under the provisions of the Act of Congress Approved, April 19, 1908.

That she is the widow of Frederick Base, who was buried under the name of Frederick Base, at [blank], on the 19th day of August, 1861, as a Private in Co. B, 29th New York Volunteers, Here state rank, and company and regiment, in the Army, or vessels, if in the Navy. and honorably discharged Feb. 18, 1863, having served ninety days or more during the late civil war.

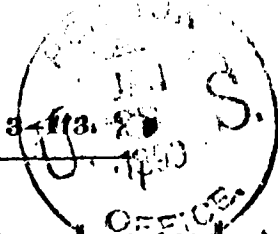
